The news is now out that I have resigned as Senior Minister of First Christian Church. In just a few weeks I will begin a new ministry as a Chaplain Resident at the University of Colorado Hospital in Aurora. God is calling me in a new direction, and it has been a very challenging choice to make to leave this congregation. It is with sadness that I leave, but also with excitement for my new focus in ministry.

With any change we are prone to fear, doubt, and anxiety. However, when we have doubts or when we become fixated on our fears that make us want to turn and run away, perhaps what we need is strong dose of a prescription called faith. We know that faith is a gift from God and God wants to grow the seeds of faith within each one of us. God will be your guide and guardian. God is not done with you yet—not by a long shot—but *as a whole congregation* you need to **choose life!**

There are some wonderful leaders in this church and I know that by coming together,

supporting one another, and working along with Rev. Jose Morales, Executive Regional Minister, and Rev. Marty Hermanstorfer, Associate Regional Minister for Search and Call, God will find a way and will keep on surprising you.

There is a poem I have always liked written by an anonymous author:

*God has not promised skies always blue,
Flower-strewn pathways all our lives through,
God has not promised sun without rain,
Joy without sorrow, peace without pain.
God has not promised we shall not know
Toil and temptation, trouble and woe.
He has not told us we shall not bear
Many a burden, many a care.
But God has promised strength for the day,
Rest for the laborer, light for the way,
Grace for the trials, help from above
Unfailing, sympathy, undying love.*

“Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee,” is such a beautiful prayer—*Melt the clouds of sin and sadness, drive our fear and doubt away.* Fear and doubt so easily get hold of us and we can quickly begin to feel that we are in the midst of a chaotic storm with no way back to the safety of dry land. But God is our strength, our hope, and our joy! May God teach us all to embrace our challenges, and forgive us when we try to avoid the difficult decisions that are right in front of us. May we be brought closer and closer to God as we replace doubts that consume our hearts with faith and courage. God will find a way.

Tracy's TidBits

So we're not giving up. How could we! Even though on the outside it often looks like things are falling apart on us, on the inside, where God is making new life, not a day goes by without God's unfolding grace. 2 Corinthians 4:16, The Message

I just finished my Sudoku and I always feel such a sense of accomplishment upon finishing one of those each morning. I feel on the top of my game and in control. I control where the numbers go, but this was a hard one today and I realized that not even on my Sudoku am I really in charge. If I put a number in the wrong place then that affects everything else and it all goes wrong. The person who created the puzzle is the one who dictates my moves.



At the time I am writing this it's about a week before VBS starts and I'm a bit worried because I feel so ill prepared this year. I knew I had a full plate at the start of the summer with camp plans, Central Rocky Mountain Region board meetings, time with family and friends who drop by from out of town, a concert, a ball game, VBS, and the possibility of a vacation. What I didn't know was that I'd have several funerals to attend and one to help plan, that we'd be in an accident that would total our car, or that our senior minister was going to resign. Now I find myself in a constant internal whirlwind of cares and worries and wondering how it is all going to get done and how is it going to turn out. Tammy led vacation Bible school last year and so I feel like I'm forgetting things, leaving something important out... Am I really the one who is supposed to be doing this? The donations board is still half full of things that are needed that no one has donated yet. I feel as if I must have put a number in the wrong place and everything has gone wrong. I'd rather just work a puzzle or go back to bed than work on what needs to be done. Give me a hole to climb into to hide for a while.

With all that has been going on at the church I'm sure some of you are feeling the same way about things. We already had financial concerns that we've had to make some difficult choices about staffing and then the AC/ heater goes out in the sanctuary, and Reverend Rebecca announces that she will be following her call to chaplaincy and will be leaving FCC-Loveland. Where's the hole to climb into? Maybe you are considering just not showing up at the church at all and going to wait out the storm or retreat to a different church for a while. Hide from your cares and worries!

I personally would love to do that! But... I love God more and I feel him calling me beyond myself to Him and I feel God calling First Christian Church to go beyond what we believe is possible to the incredible opportunities that God has in store for us. When my family faces adversities we don't separate to our own separate holes to hide in we make a point to get out and to support each other so that none of us are left in a hole and that is how I see that we as a church must respond at this time. We must become closer and support our church family even more. We must not withdraw from each other but come closer together with each other and with God. When Brad, my husband, and I worked together on this morning's Sudoku it went easier than if we'd done it by ourselves, though it still wasn't easy.

It won't be easy to get through this time but it will go better if we do it together rather than if we scatter. God doesn't promise us easy but he does promise that what we go through is worth it! How do we get through? Get close to God through prayer and study and close to each other through fellowship. We will also need to expand our circles of influence by reaching out to others.



I subscribe to a journal called *Weavings: A Journal of the Christian Spiritual Life* and the theme for this latest issue is *Do Not Lose Heart* and this is a prayer by Rueben Job from that issue: "Creator God, Author and Maker of all that is, God of goodness, grace, and love. Like Your followers of old our outer nature is wasting away, we seem impotent in the face of hate, violence, and war. In our weakness and confusion we are often in retreat or in hiding even as we cry out to You for redemption and life. Today we once again hear Your call, "Follow Me," and with Your grace washing over us and Your Spirit guiding and strengthening us we claim our full inheritance as Your daughters and sons, offering all that we are and have to You. Because we are Yours alone we do not lose heart. We rise up and claim the strength that only You can give to begin living a new life of integrity and faithfulness in confidence and trust in Your sustaining grace. Amen.

Let this be our prayer. *Tracy Morgan, Christian Ed Minister*
