A SEASON OF DISCIPLINE

One of the interesting trends for the church in the past several decades has been a recovery of ancient traditions and practices. In the same way, some of our traditions we believe to be very old (like Christmas) are relatively recent.

I mention this in anticipation of the fast-approaching season of Lent. Like many in our congregation, I grew up in a time and place where observance of Lent was largely thought to be a “Catholic thing”. If someone appeared on a Wednesday with a black cross on their foreheads or spoke of giving up something for Lent, they were pretty much assumed to be Roman Catholic.

Following the so-called ‘Protestant Reformation’, many Christian traditions sought to distinguish themselves from the doctrine and rituals of the Roman Church. Observance of the Christian calendar, feast days, and seasons of Advent and Lent were widely abandoned – along with anything else that might seem “too Catholic”.

My upbringing in a Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) congregation was probably typical; I have no memory of following the three year cycle of scriptures known as the Lectionary. We observed Maundy Thursday but not Good Friday. Christmas came without the season of preparation known as Advent. I was 30 years old before I ever participated in an Ash Wednesday service.

The recovery of ancient rites and practices has been a healthy step for the church. It has been noted in many articles and studies that younger Christians today often seek and appreciate the sense of mystery so long set aside in many of our churches.

What is left to recover for many is the heart of what it means to be Christian – a follower of Christ. For reasons too extensive to elaborate here, the word “believer” has been embraced as a popular name for Christians. People proudly remember when they “became a believer”, ask strangers “are you a believer?”, and readily (and judgmentally) between those who “believe” and those who do not.

When this jargon gets too thick, I’m reminded of the 1960’s song, “I’m a Believer” written by Neil Diamond and recorded by the band *The Monkees*. The song speaks in the voice of one who once doubted that romantic love would come, but now has come to “believe” because he’s fallen in love. It was

reprised in 2001 for touching end to the movie, *Shrek*.

For many Christians, the situation is similar; being in love with God/Jesus is like being in love with a human and moving to the ecstatic stage of “I’m a Believer!” is wonderful and palpable.

The problem is that Jesus doesn’t just ask for believers, he asks for disciples. In the Gospels and in subsequent scriptures, we’re told that we are to follow Jesus example and reflect our love of God in the way we show love for our neighbors.

What is the difference between a believer and a disciple? One who claims status as a believer often presents as someone who has been introduced to and fully embraced a truth, so much so they feel confident in proclaiming it to others. In fact, the proclamation itself is the major point of practice.

The word *disciple* comes from a Latin word that means a pupil or follower. By definition, one who is a true disciple spends more time learning than proclaiming. The disciple, in humility, accepts that there is always more to learn and follows a *discipline* in becoming a better *disciple*.

Those words – *discipline* and *humility* – are at the heart of our observance in the season of Lent. We *humble* ourselves physically (with the imposition of ashes) and spiritually by our admission that we have fallen short of God’s desire for us. We undertake a *discipline* during the 40 days of Lent with the intention of bringing ourselves closer to God.

Traditionally, the discipline was fasting – foregoing food during certain times or at least changing our dietary patterns so that we might focus on God instead of our own desires. Some still do so today, while others fast more symbolically. They refrain from other things than food for instance. Other Christians will take on something extra rather than giving up; they might commit to more volunteer service or some kind of service to others. Still others will undertake of a discipline of uncluttering their lives physically, spiritually, and emotionally. I’ve also known persons during Lent who would intentionally seek to make amends for past wrongs.

As we remember the 40 days Jesus was tempted in the wilderness, the 40 days we spend laying aside our own temptations also bring us closer to God.


FOR YOUNG ADULTS:




