THANKSGIVING FOR OUR STAFF

Among the many joys of my ministry in FCC Loveland is the quality of professional and Volunteer staff assembled here. As the year



close and another commences, I use my space this month to share with you who they are and some of what they do.

The **mission support** staff work with congregation members and others to carry out our ministries. If you're here for worship Sunday mornings, you are aware of our excellent musicians. Our organist **Karen Lee** is an accomplished music teacher with a background in other aspects of Music. **Gina Schuh-Turner** directs both the chancel choir and handbell choir, as well as organizing and directing the Easter and Christmas Cantatas. Her brother **Troy Schuh** accompanies the choir on piano.

Another important aspect of worship is providing reliable and trustworthy care for children. **Tammy Swartz** recruits and checks the background of our childcare providers so that parents may be confident that their children are safe.

Max and Marcia Peters are our facilities managers. Although cleaning and maintenance is part of their responsibilities, it is a misconception to say they are custodians. Both are heavily involved in planning for and accommodating the needs for events inside and outside our congregation.

The role of **Kirsten Bayne** is also frequently underestimated. As Office Administrator, she has a wide variety of responsibility for independent decision making across the spectrum of all our ministries. Clerical support is a very small portion of what she does on behalf of our church.

All those mentioned above are part-time employees, and all put in more hours and effort than their salaries and job descriptions reflect. In the two years I've been here, none of them have ever said "that's not my job" when asked to do something. In fact, they are more likely to

find additional work and do it without being asked.

Our pastoral leadership team is a dedicated group who contribute much to our congregational life. Other than myself, **Rachel Nelson** is the only paid member of this staff. As Minister to Emerging Generations, her job description includes ministry to youth and young adults, in addition to significant responsibilities for worship planning and other aspects of ministry. Her work expectations and contributions have grown in the past two years, without additional compensation.

Dora DeVan joined us in the fall as Ministry Intern. In addition to her graduate studies at Iliff School of Theology, she also works a full-time job. In addition to preaching and teaching, she is working with other committees and groups in the congregation to help us move forward.

Pam Hilliard is our Minister for Grief and Loss, and is commissioned for ministry by the Central Rocky Mountain Region DOC. She works fulltime for *Group Mission Trips*, and has been instrumental in our mission station project. She leads a weekly grief support group, and frequently preaches pulpit supply for other congregations in addition to ours.

Also serving as a Commissioned Minister is **Tracy Morgan**. Tracy has shifted emphasis over the course of her ministry from the youngest to the oldest generations. She does extensive visitation, leads worship at nursing homes and care facilities, as well as other ministry.

Above and beyond their other responsibilities, the pastoral leadership team meets on a regular basis to plan the "nuts and bolts" of worship services.

I ask you this month and throughout the year to express your gratitude to these servants – unpaid and underpaid – and to pray for them regularly. Although I am often the public face of our church in worship and elsewhere, they are truly deserving of the credit for what we have been able to accomplish in the past two years.

Small Actions, Big Impact

The last full weekend in October, there was quite a bit of activity in our Mission Station, as we hosted the Central Rocky Mountain Region's CYF (high school) youth Fall Retreat. Youth and adult sponsors from Denver, Evergreen, Conifer, Loveland, Fort Collins, Greeley, Colorado Springs, Casper (WY), and Farmington (NM) gathered for a weekend of fellowship, service, and worship.

The theme for the weekend was "Small Actions, Big Impact". The region's Executive Council of Youth (ECOY), a team of high school youth from around the region, chose this theme to convey the message that oftentimes our actions of service may be quite small in comparison to the large problems our communities face (locally, nationally, and globally), but many small actions on the part of many people can nonetheless have a very big impact. Sometimes it's even a single person's single small action that can have a big impact on another person.

This theme was explored in practice in two ways. First, the group spent the better part of Saturday working on four homes in Lyons that had been badly damaged in last fall's flood. We worked alongside the homeowners and long term volunteers to do landscaping, foundation painting, salvaging of wood from a wrecked foundation, digging to expose and extract a water line, etc.. It was hard work, but we found it moving to hear the homeowners' stories and quite meaningful to be empowered to help in the recovery efforts. Though our work seemed small in comparison to the scope of the projects that needed to be completed for these homeowners, we estimated hundreds of dollars of labor that we donated, as well as the emotional benefits of reminding those we served that they still aren't alone. We were moved by the impact that can be made by even one day of work.

Then, the group spent the main part of Sunday morning at one of our local assisted living homes, visiting with the residents, giving them gifts they'd hand painted the night before, and decorating pumpkins together. Again, the visit was a relatively small action, but the impact on residents and youth alike in their sharing meaningful time together was much greater. We left the retreat tired out from our labors, but uplifted by the time spent with one another centered on God and God's work. On behalf of the region's ministry to youth, thank you again for sharing our building with these young disciples, and to Kathy and Susan for helping make sure we were well fed!

In early January, our college aged young adults will have a similar opportunity to engage together in service projects that may seem small individually, but that will impact communities in need, through a short, service oriented mission trip to Denver. Adults aged 18-23ish are invited to sign up for minimal cost, and will stay at a church in Denver while serving various community organizations, reflecting and relaxing together in the evenings.
