RECOVERY AND RESTORATION

It was joyful and surprising news a couple of weeks ago when highway 34 opened through the canyon between Loveland and Estes Park. The determination of work crews and the blessing of a mild fall combined to provide opportunity for construction on the flood-ravaged roadway.



Not long after the opening, I traveled the road to meet with the volunteer coordination committees of the Larimer County and Estes Valley Long Term Recovery Groups (LTRG) in Estes Park. Since I was riding with another committee member, I could look out the passenger window and snap a few pictures of the river along the way.



In the several meetings I've attended in the months since the flood, we have received statistics and reports about progress on the response; even so, seeing the flooded canyon firsthand was an eye opener. It confirmed what we have been told continually – that the recovery in Northern Colorado will be a process of between two and five years.

The meeting in Estes focused on directing and equipping volunteers to work on the recovery, an effort more complicated than many realize. Who keeps track of work that is needed, and the stages of completion? How are the volunteers equipped with tools and training? How do we keep them safe in their work? Where does debris go after removal, and how does it get there? Where do volunteers sleep and eat when not on site?

These are just a handful of the logistical difficulties we face as we dig in for the long haul. For our congregation, the last is of particular

importance as we and our partners explore the possibility of a hosting volunteers in the coming years.

Our involvement was highlighted the day after my Estes visit, when we hosted one of the three training sessions for LTRGs held in Northern Colorado. In the picture below, you can read the five faith-based organizations presenting the event, along with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the American Red Cross.

On your behalf I give special thanks to your church staff and

who helped to set up more than 60 people from our community who attended. I received many compliments about our facility and quality of our hospitality.

In January we will be evaluating the available space in our building and working with our partners to begin setting up for hospitality mission. Work is underway now to establish a steering committee of members from our congregation, Fort Collins Heart of the Rockies, and Greeley First Christian Church – as well as others who may want to join in this project. The consensus from the beginning has been that we do not want this to be just an FCC Loveland ministry.

If you feel the call of the Spirit to help organize and lead in this mission, please give me a call or email and discuss how you can take part. Together we can carry out Christ's work in our community, rebuilding bridges and restoring lives.
